

As a school we are continually striving for the very best for our children. We aim to provide our children with not only a high quality curriculum in the core subjects but are committed to producing high quality enriched and enhanced curriculum for all.

Our enhanced curriculum currently includes specialist MFL teaching e.g. a specialist language teacher teaches French throughout school, Miss Maria Bernal, who is bi-lingual, teaches Spanish throughout EYFS and we have recently appointed Miss Lesniak, a Polish teacher, who will soon be introducing Italian. We are also very fortunate to be able to offer a high quality music curriculum. Side by side arts, who are music specialists deliver high quality class music lessons throughout school. 


